## National Trends

Increased use of any illicit substances Mixed use of alcohol Increased use of marijuana Decreased use of cigarettes Decreased use of cocaine and stimulants Mixed use of prescription medication Increased use of tranquilizers

## Local Trends

Continued use of alcohol and marijuana
Increased use of prescription medication
Increased use of heroin
Increased use of combining drugs
Community resurgence of cocaine use

### Substance Abuse – Definition

- Pattern of recurrent use leading to impairment of functioning
- Failure to meet obligations of school, work or home
- Recurrent use in physically hazardous situations
- Legal problems resulting from use
- Continued use despite social/interpersonal problems

## Prescription Drug Abuse

Non-medical use of prescription drugs

### **Commonly Abused Prescription Drugs**

Opiates
Tranquilizers/Sedatives
Stimulants
Cough suppressants

## Misuse of Prescription Drugs Prevalence

U.S. lifetime misuse: 48 million
20% of U.S. population
Second only to marijuana use
First time misuse of pain relievers exceeds first time use of marijuana

## **Risk Factors**

- Chaotic home environment
- Lack of parental supervision
- Poor parent-child attachments
- Shy or aggressive school behavior
- Failure in school
- Poor social coping skills
- Deviant peers
- Approval of drug use behavior

## **Risk Factors**

Parental drug/alcohol abuse
Children with emotional problems
Abused or neglected children
Drop outs
Economically disadvantaged
Genetic disposition

## **Protective Factors**

- Strong, positive family bonds
- Parental monitoring
- Clear, consistent rules
- Parental involvement
- Success in school
- Positive bond with school, religion
- Conventional norms
- Positive peer influence

## **Prevention Strategies**

Traditional educational program
Affective education
Alternative activities
Life skills curriculum
Peer Drug Education Programs
Parental involvement

## Community and School Interventions

Comprehensive public information campaign
Substance use prevention messages
Clear school policies and procedures
Identification of misuse and abuse
Evaluation and treatment mandate

- Hospitalization Detox/Psychiatric
- Boarding School
- Rehabilitation Program
- Wilderness Program
- Adolescent Day Program
- Intensive Outpatient Program
- Outpatient Program
- Private Practice
- School Counseling
