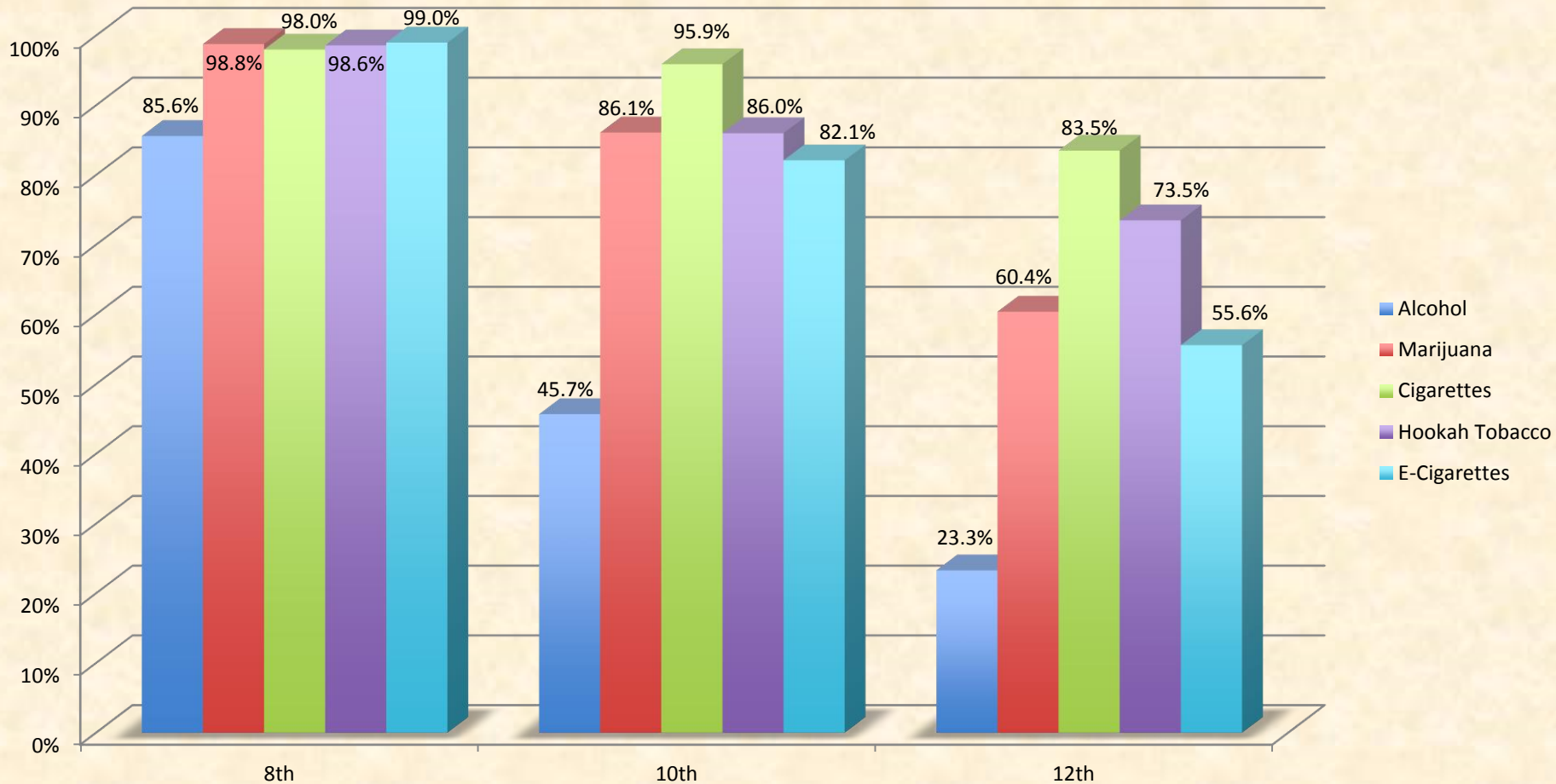

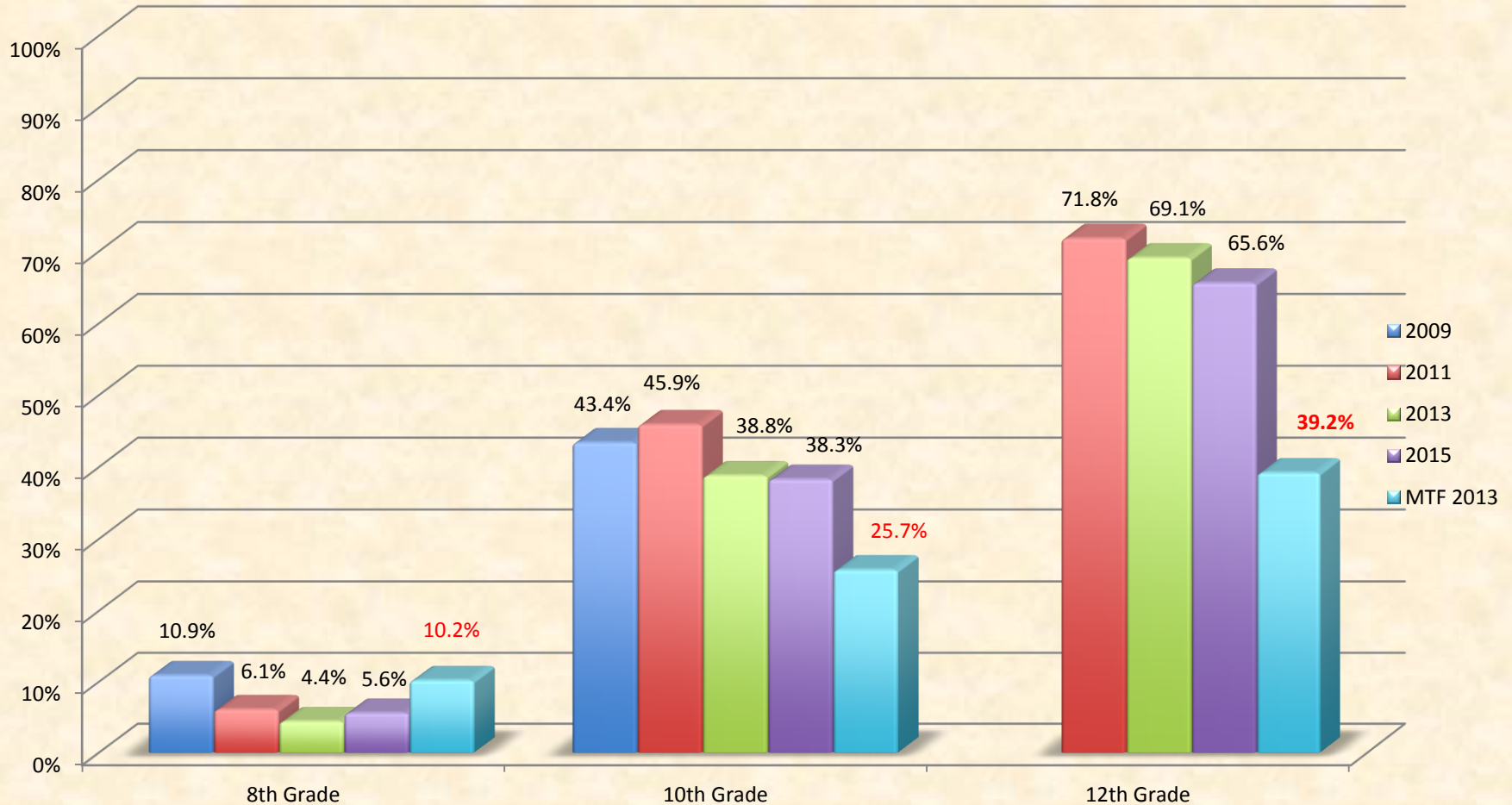

## The Good News: Youth Who Have Never Used Substances



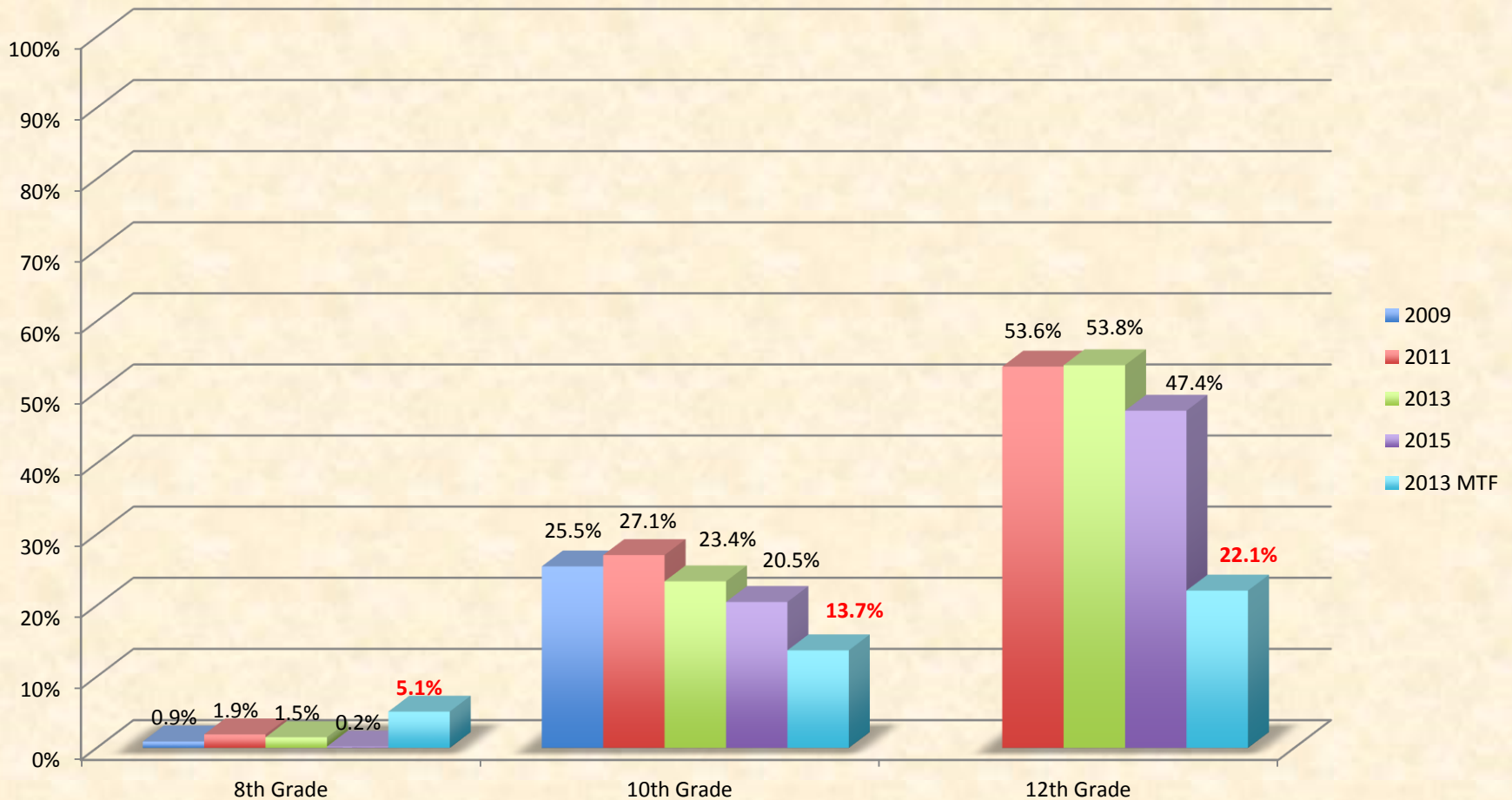
# Past 30-Day Use of Alcohol Has Decreased, But Still Above Nat'l Average for Grades 10 & 12

## Past 30-Day Alcohol Use



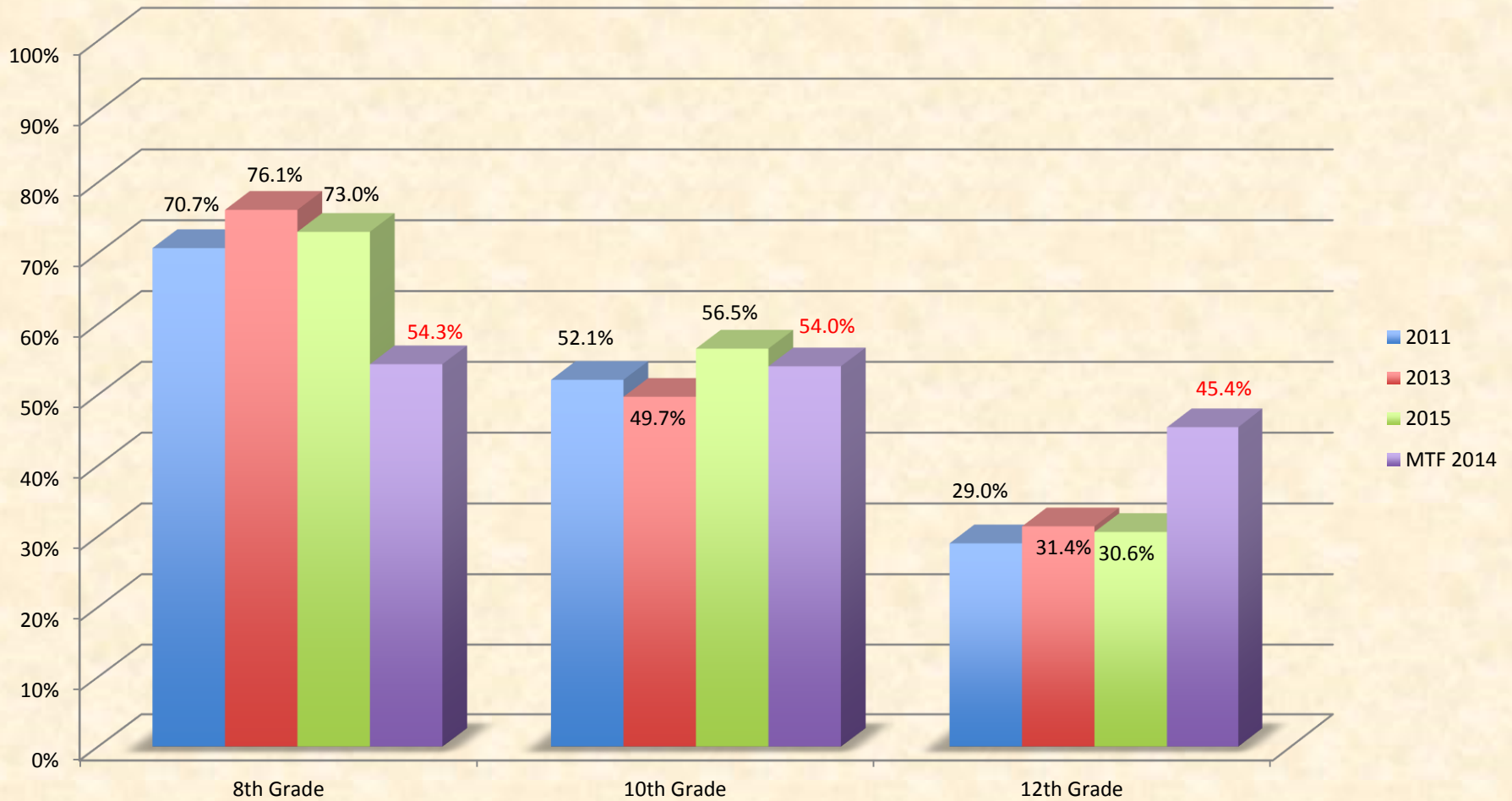
# BINGE Drinking Continues To Be A Concern for 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Graders

## Binge Drinking - 5 or More Drinks in a Row in Past 2 Weeks



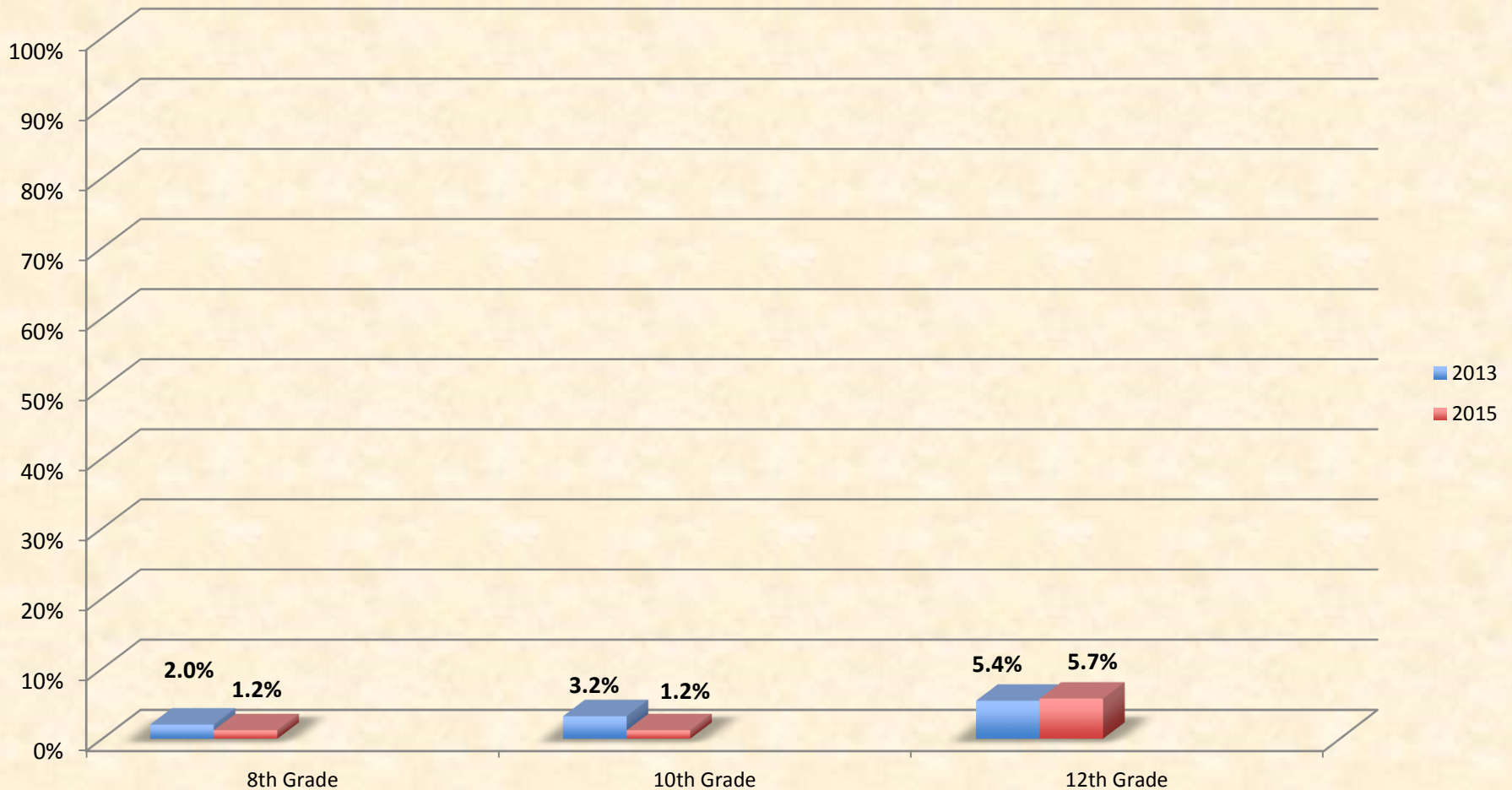

## Perceived Risk of Harm if Have 5 or More Drinks 1-2x/Week



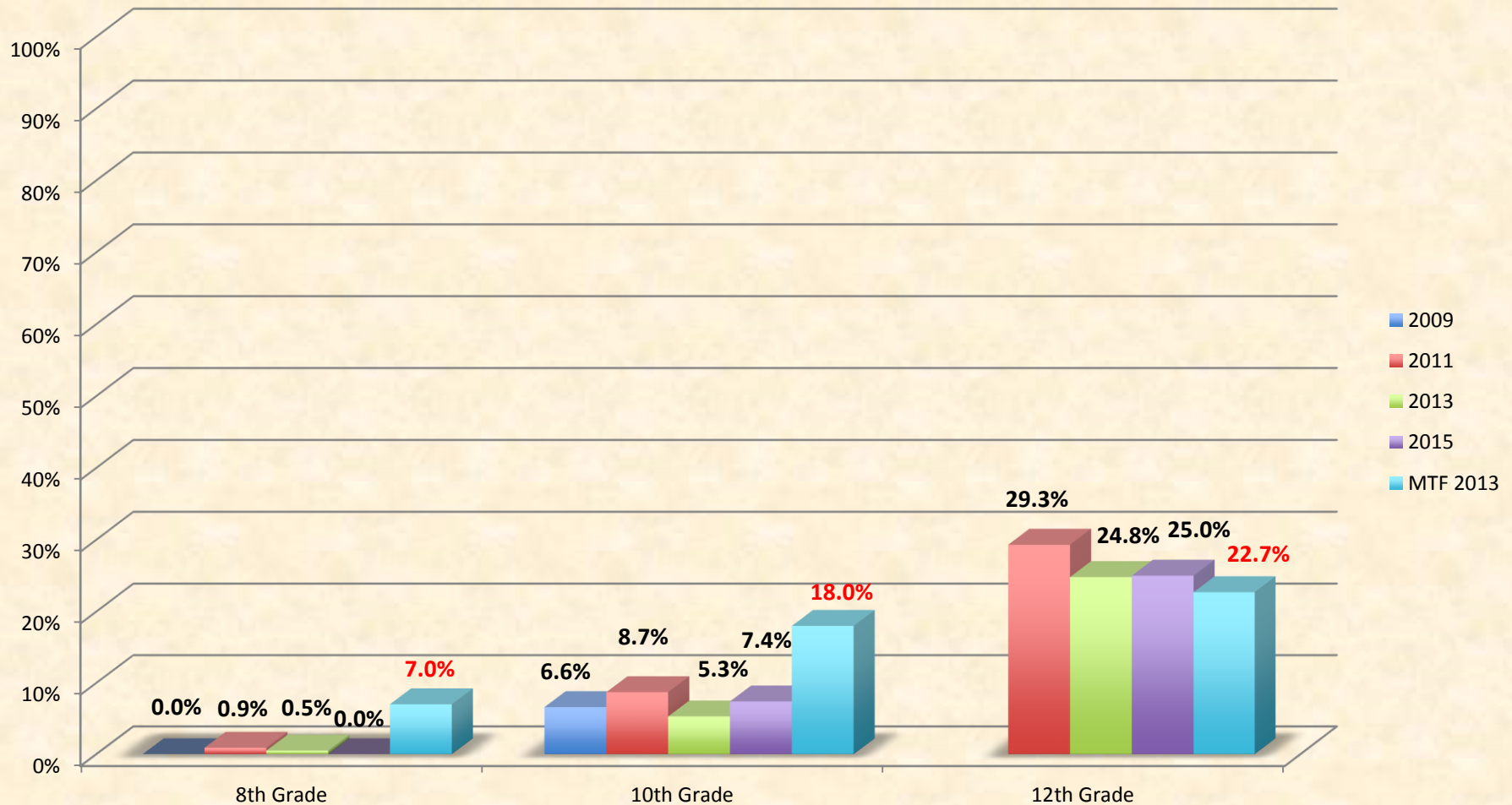
# Abuse of Prescription Drugs is Low; Drug Choice for 12<sup>th</sup> Graders is Primarily Stimulants/Amphetamines

## Past 30-Day Unprescribed Use of Prescription Drugs



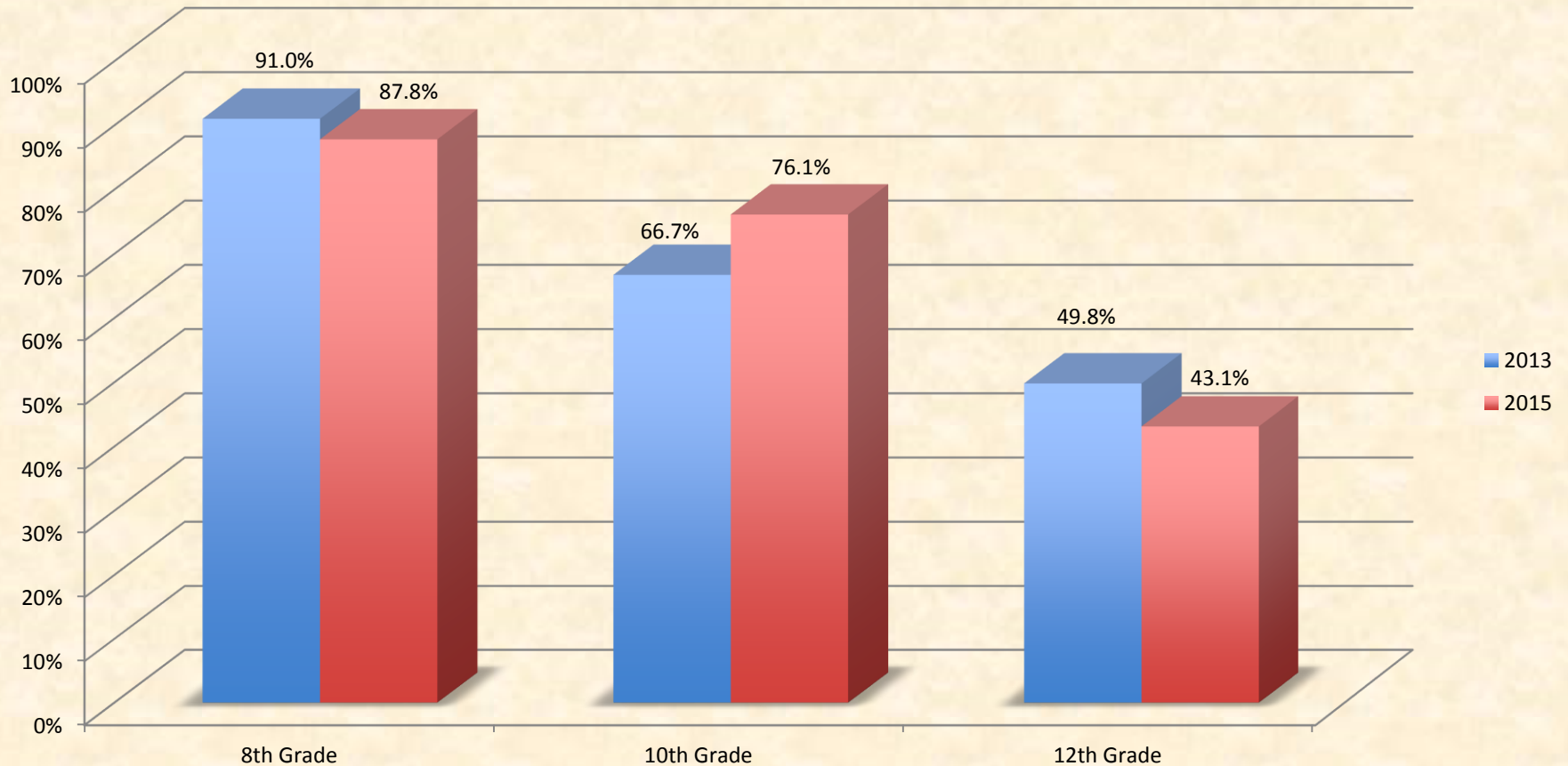

# As Perception of Risk Decreases, the Likelihood of Usage Increases

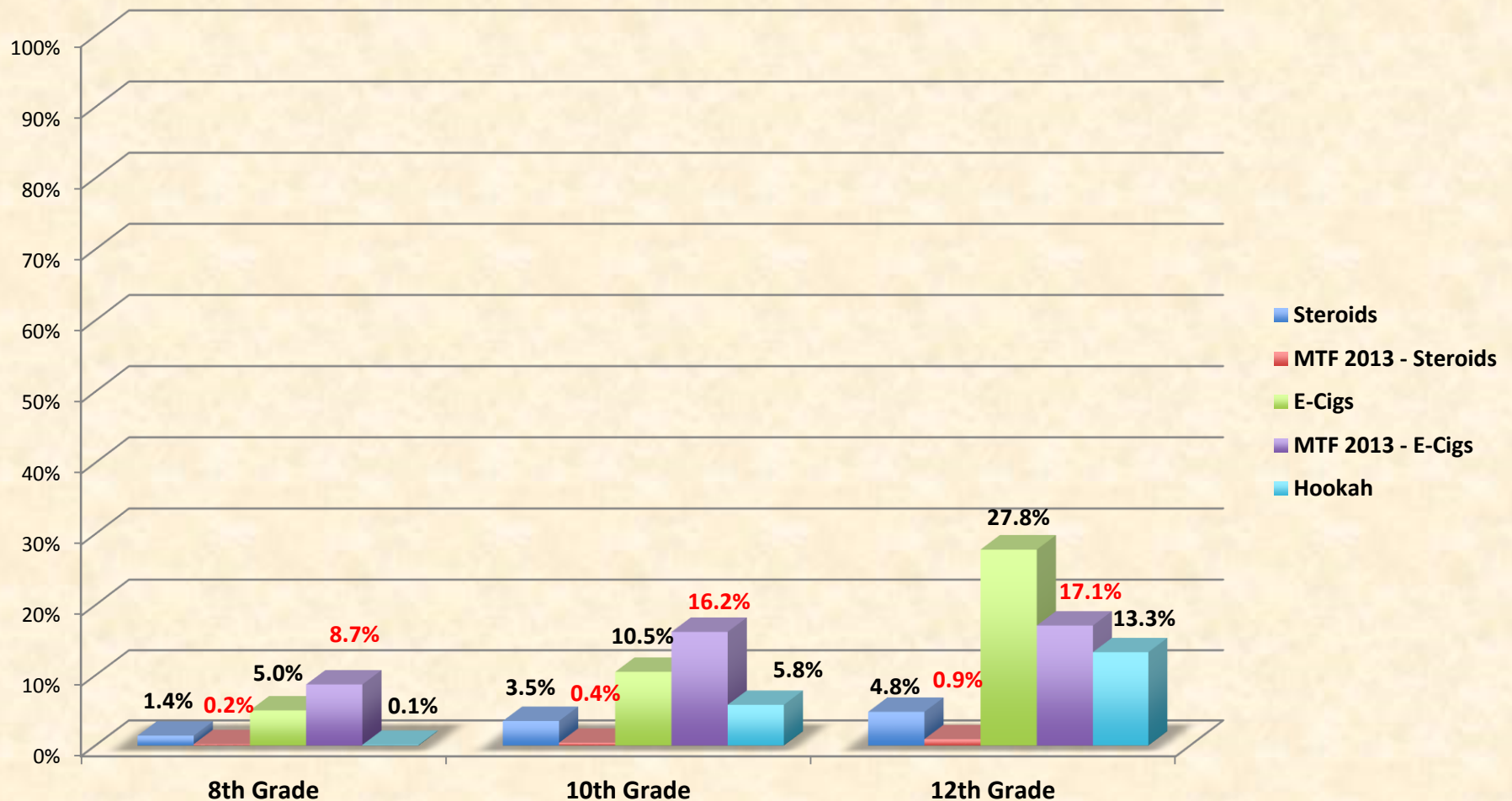
## Perception of Moderate or Great Risk if Smoke Marijuana Once or Twice a Week

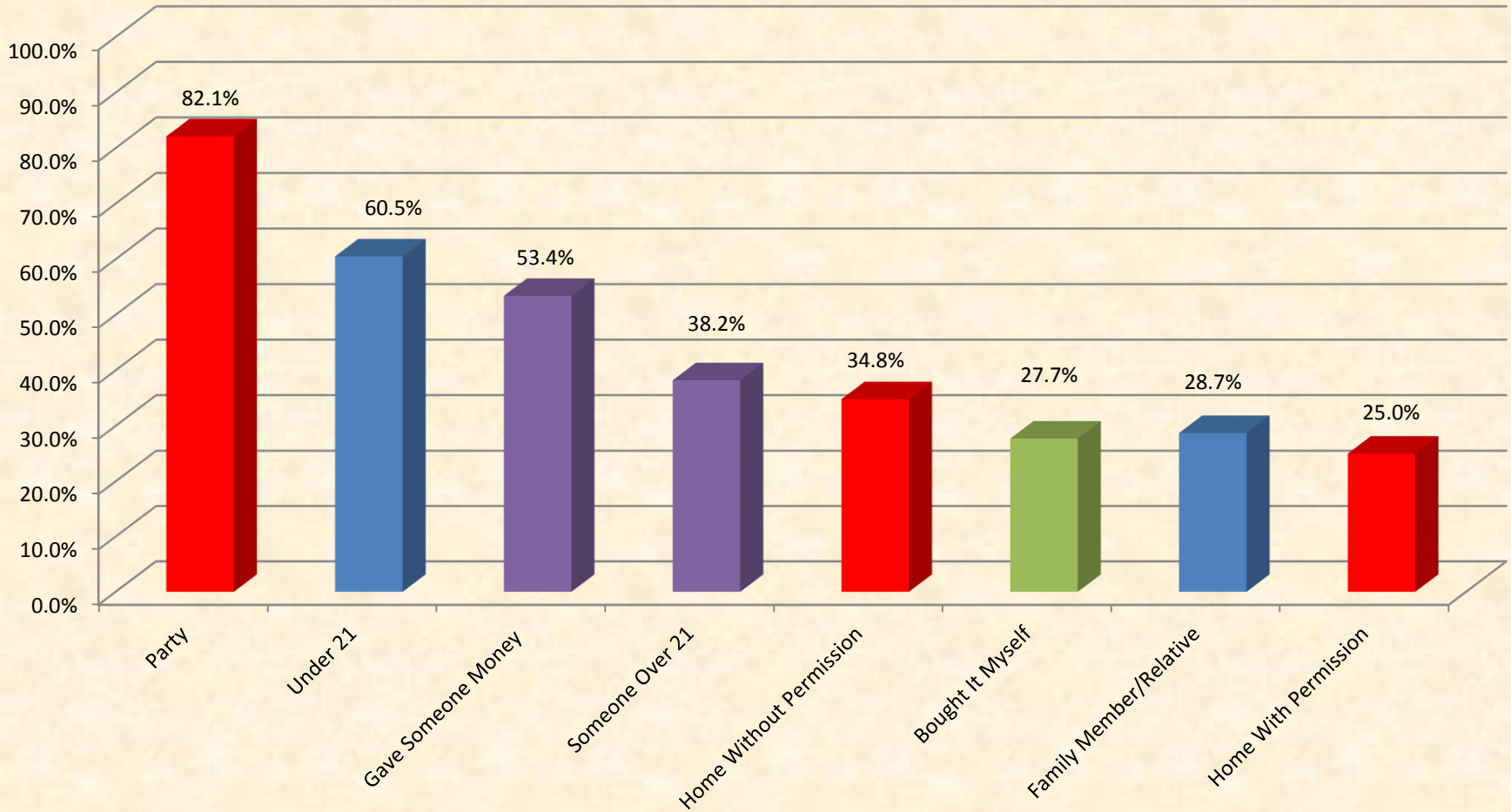

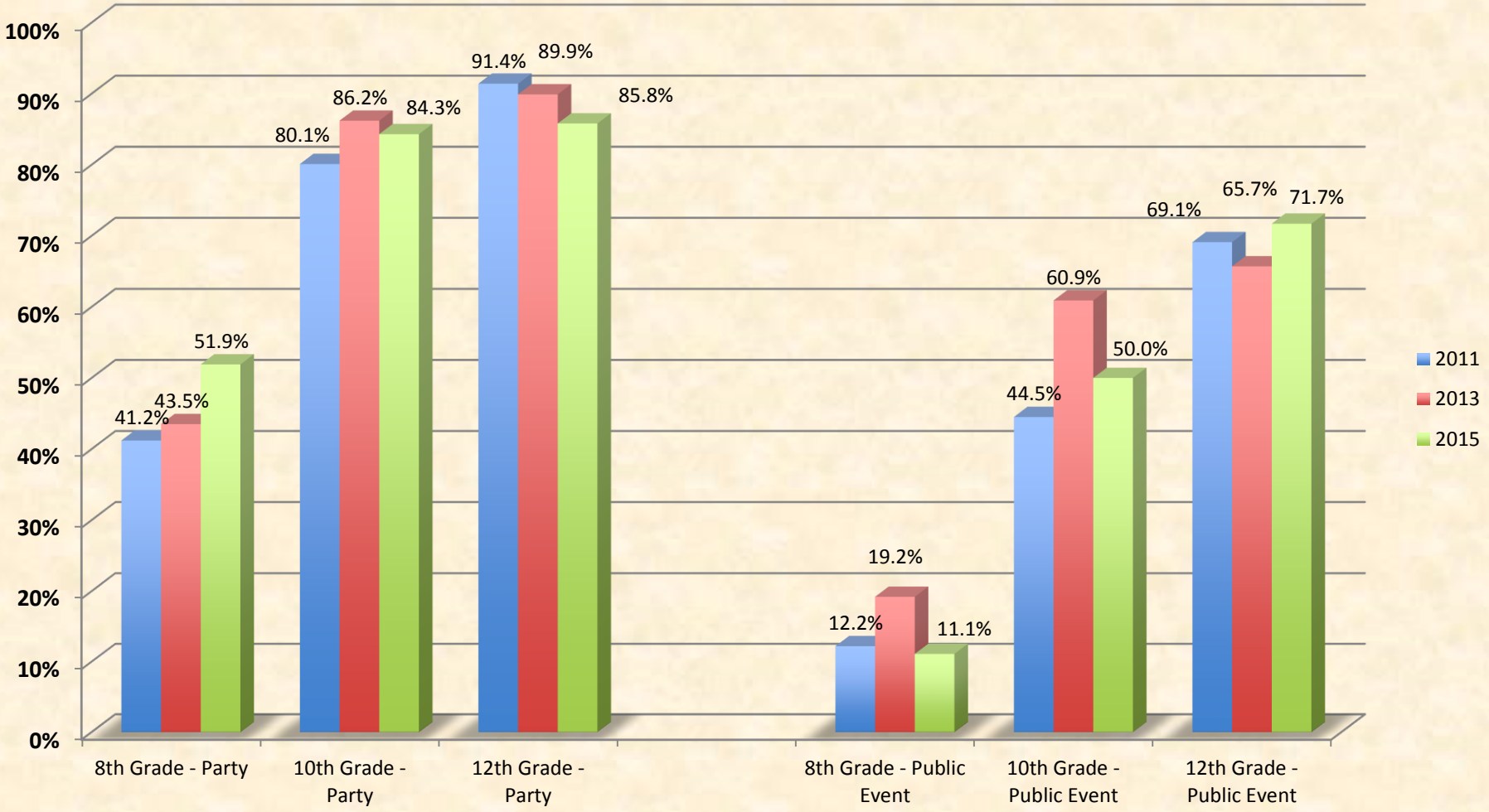

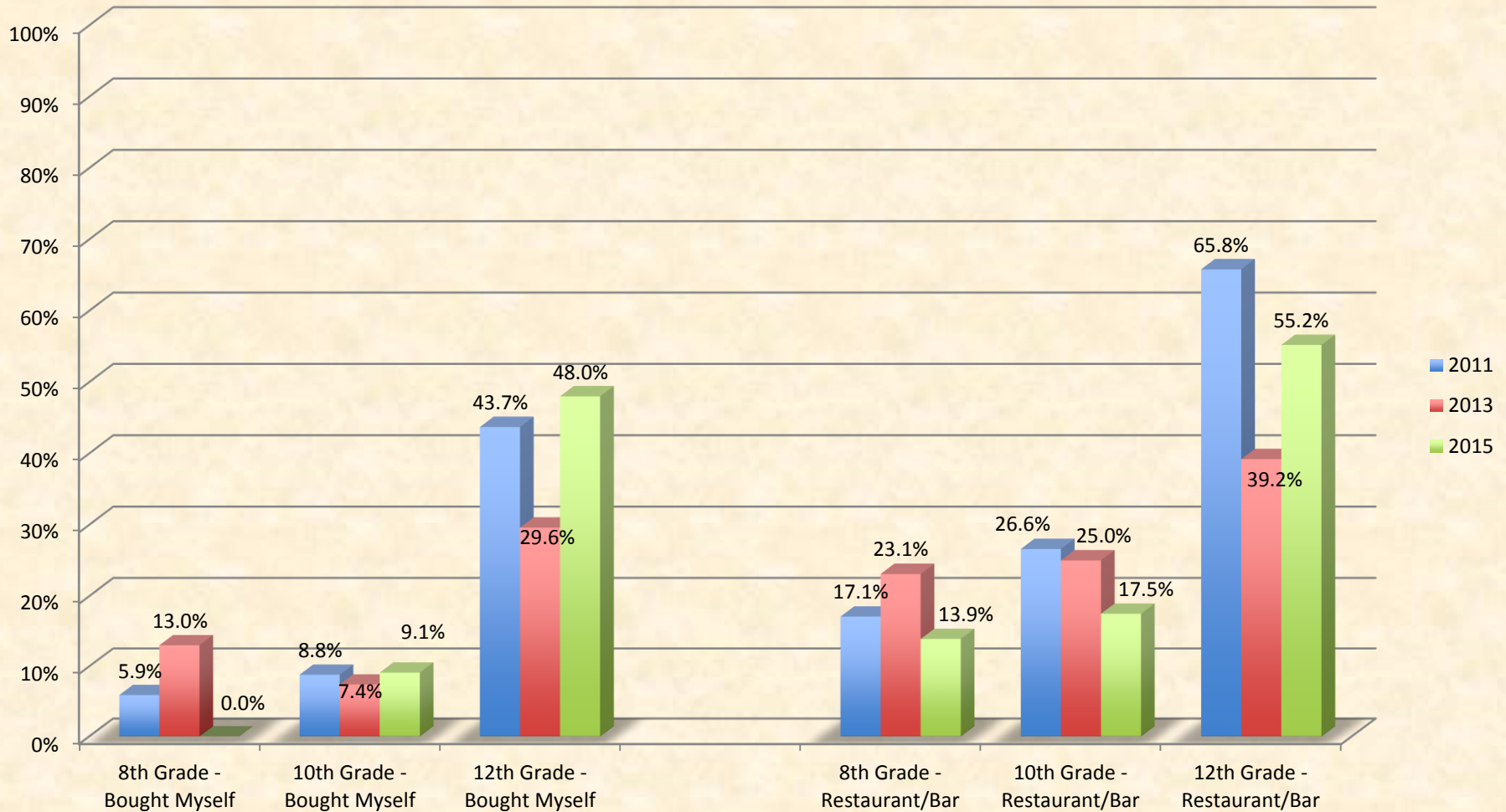

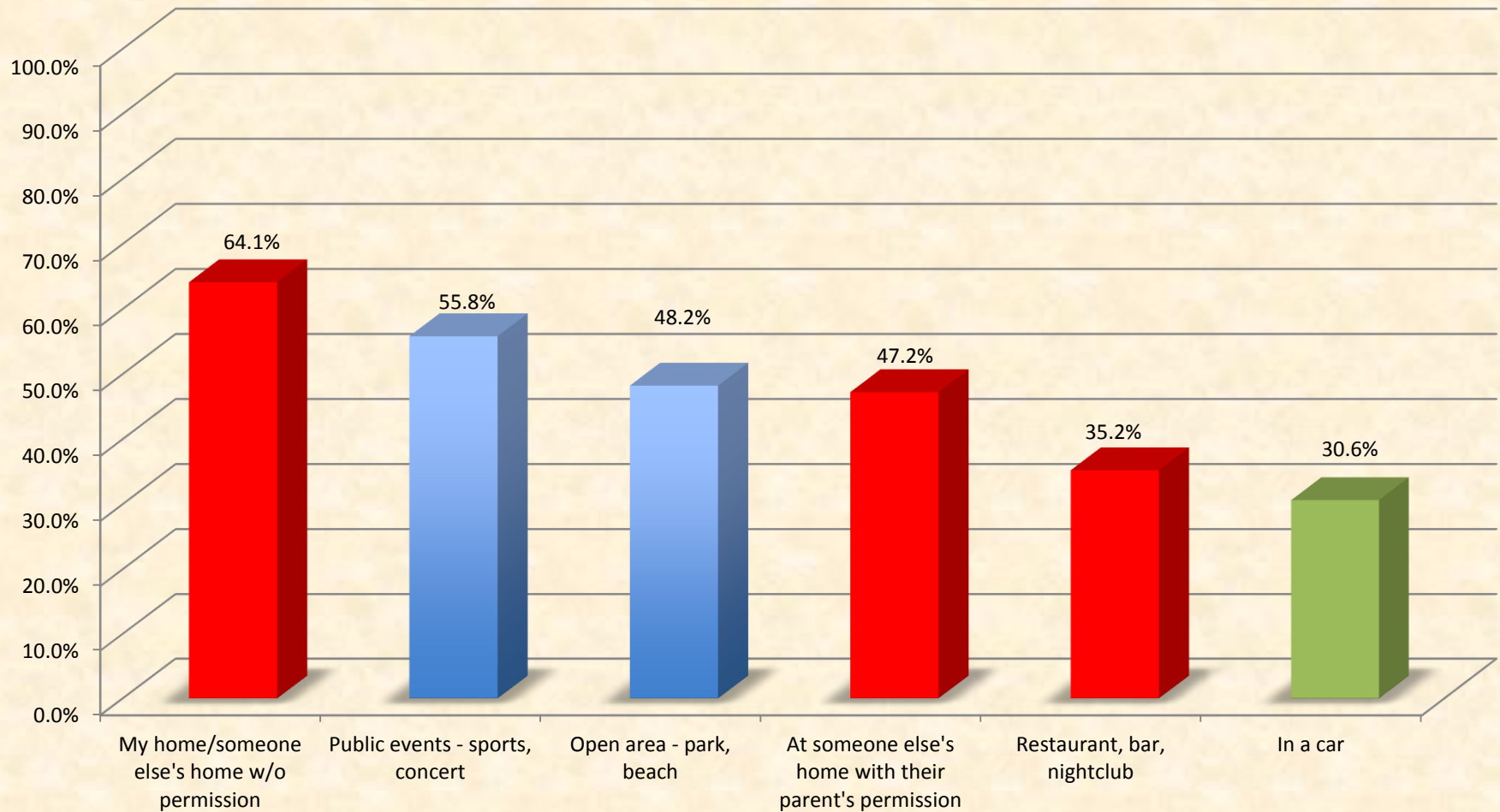

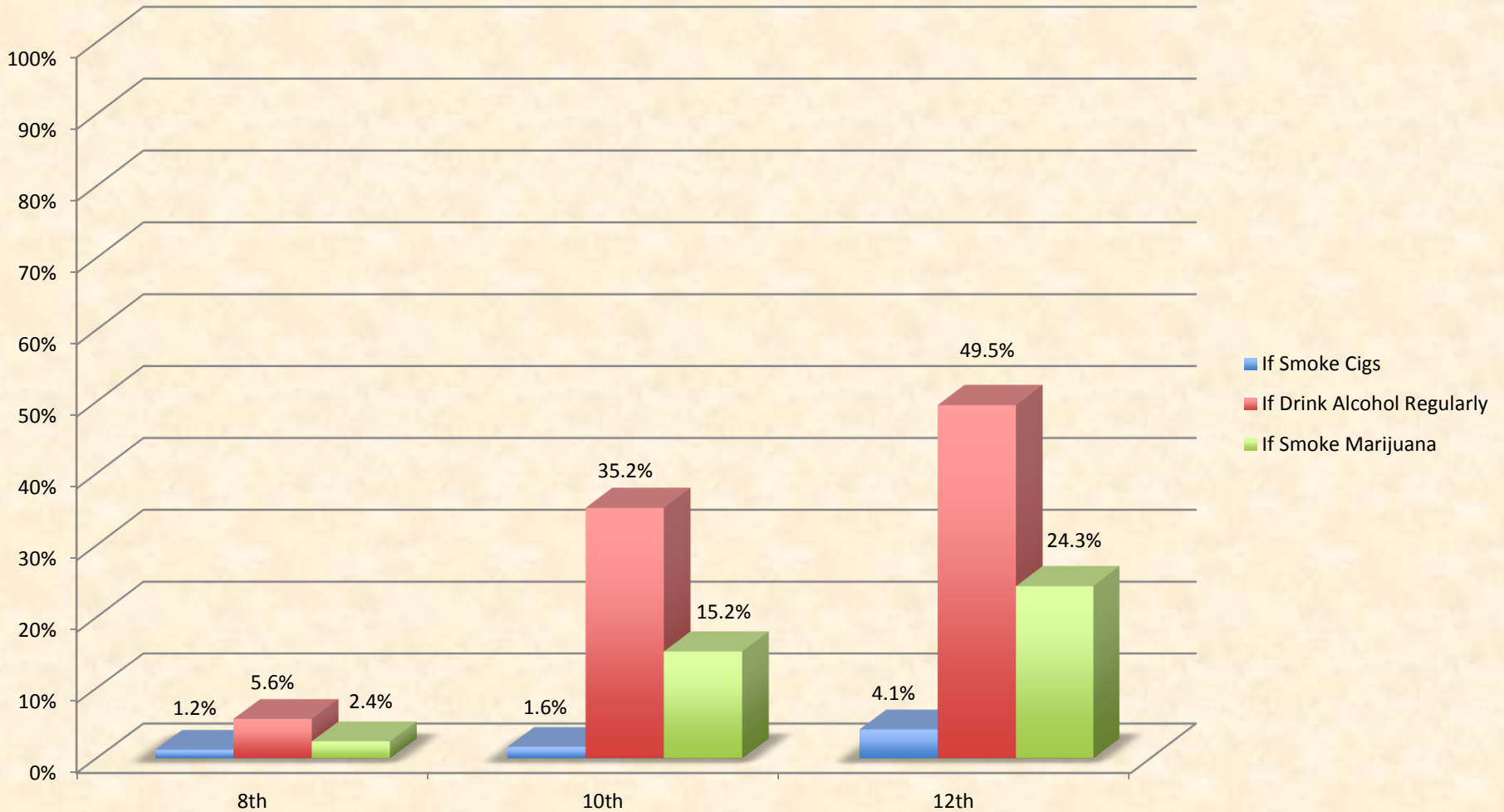

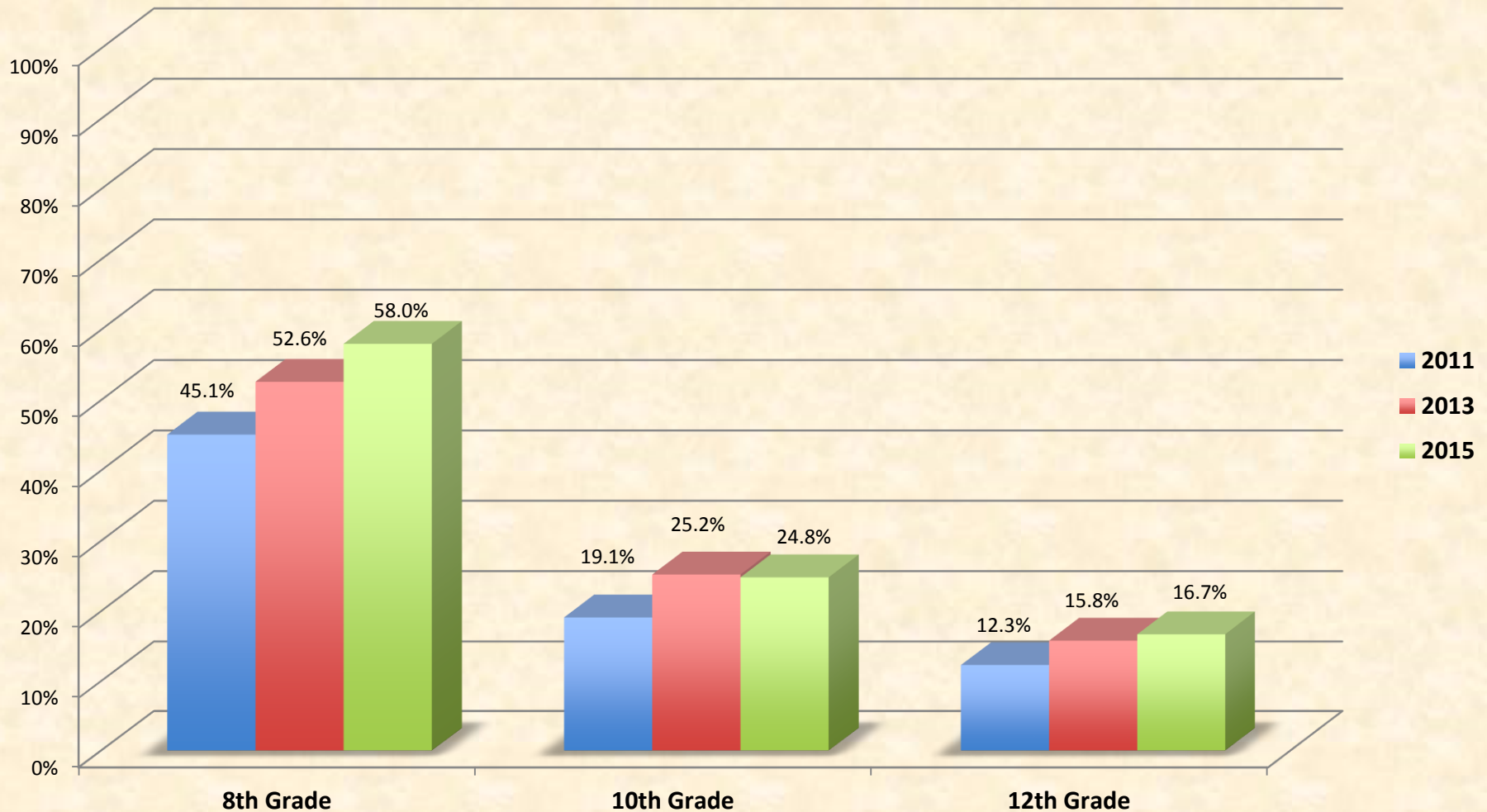

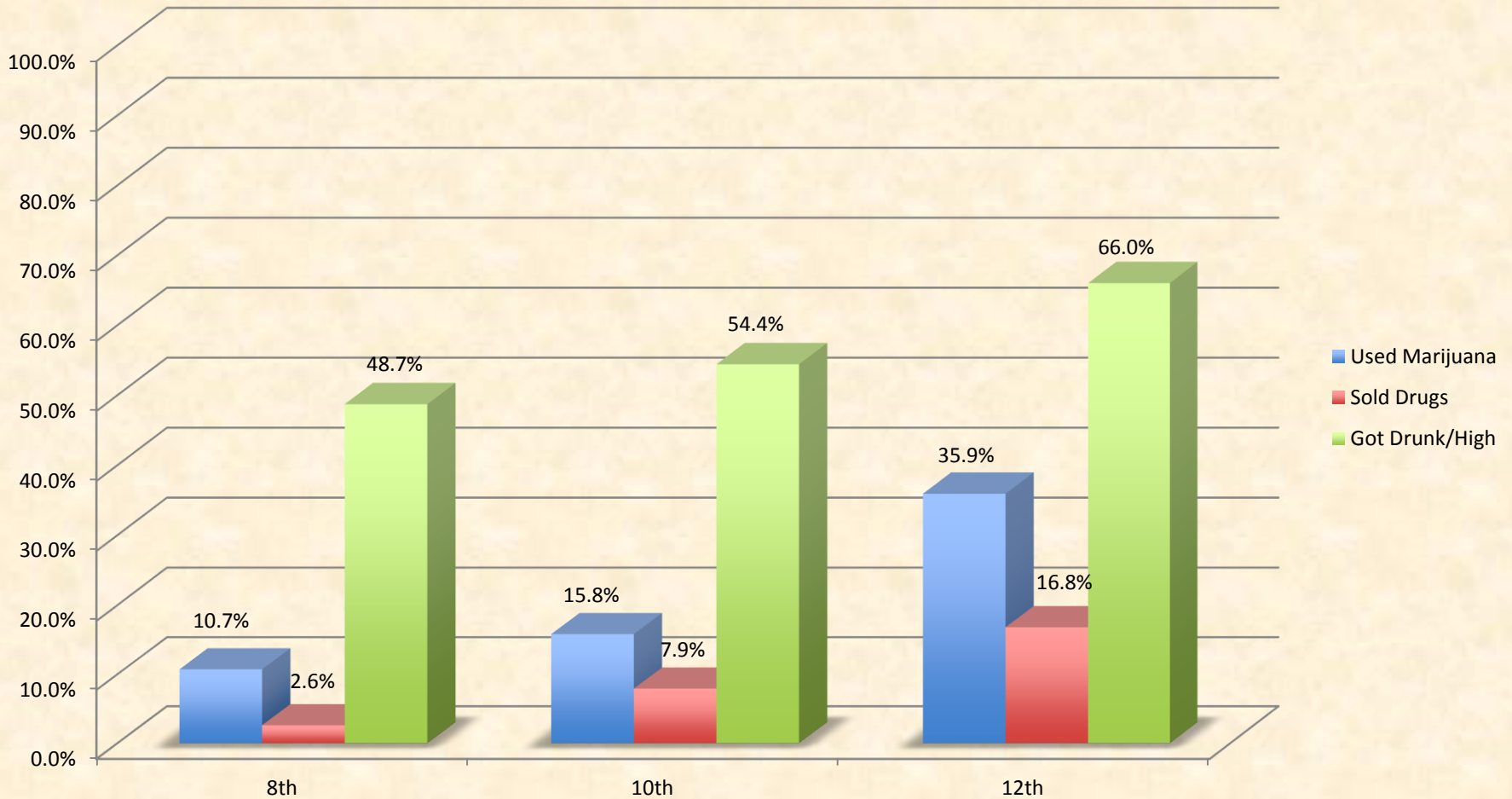

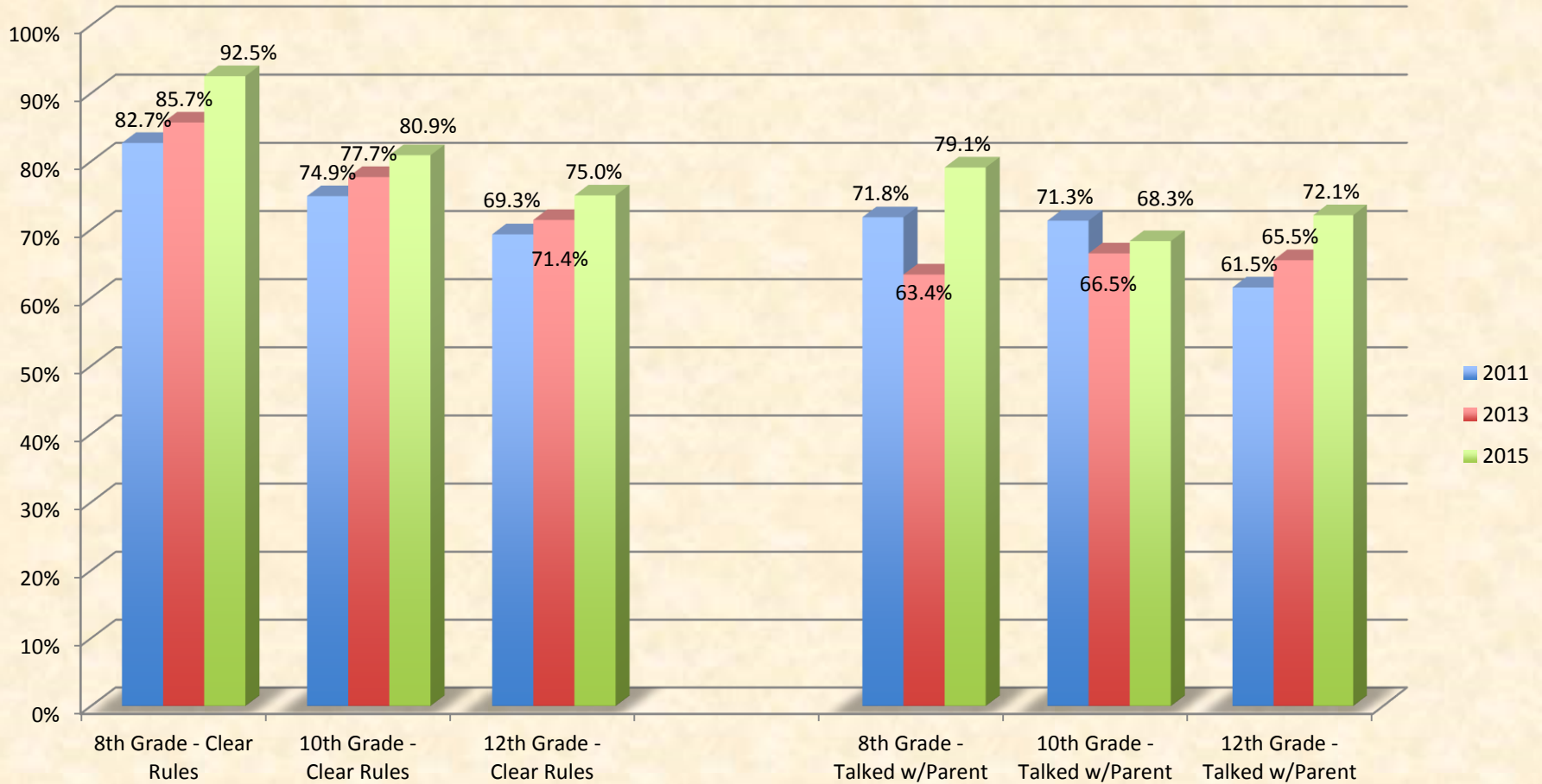
## How Many Adults Do You Know Who...In The Past Year?

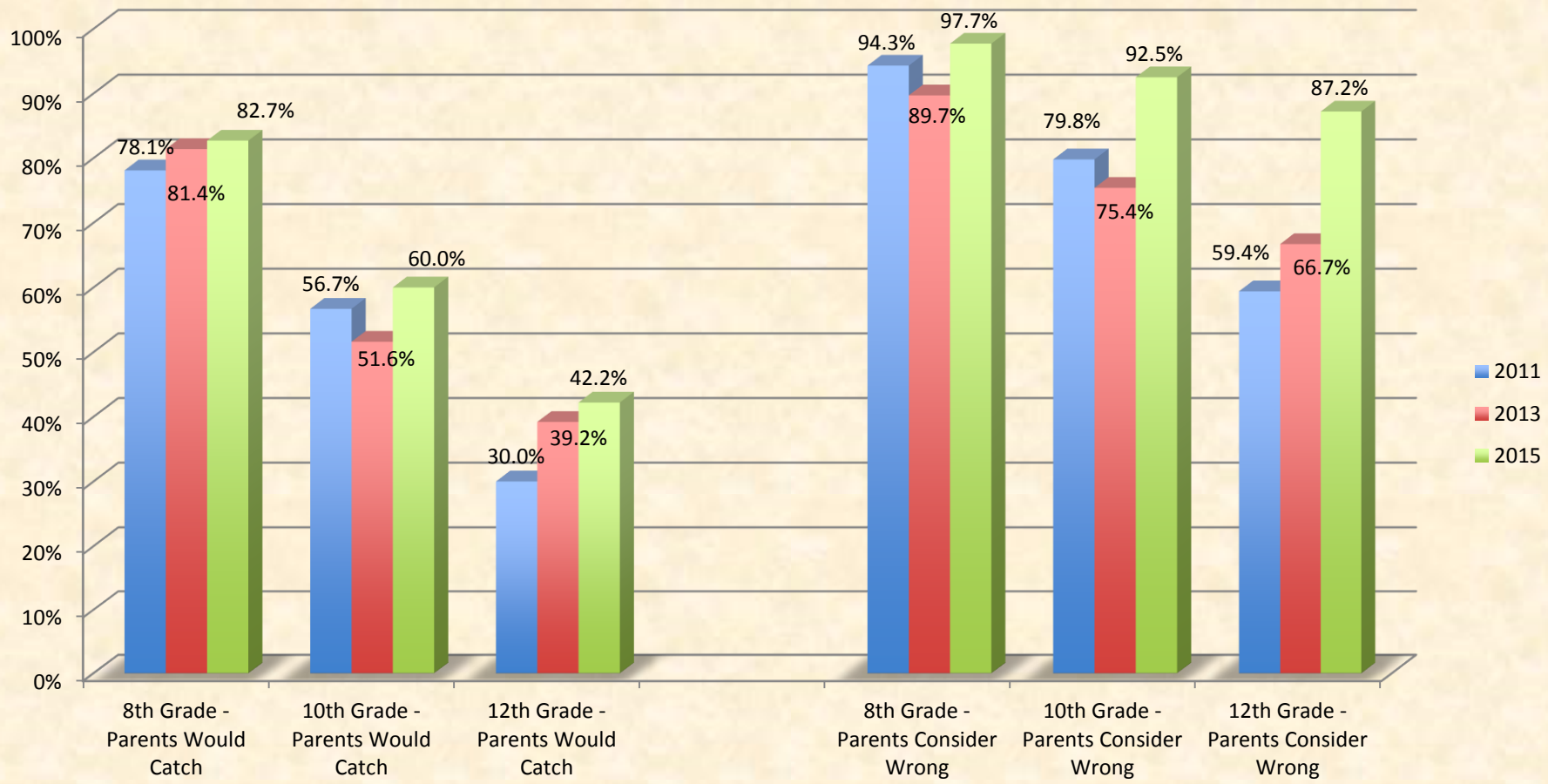
