



#### The Good News: Youth Who Have Never Used Substances




# Past 30-Day Use of Alcohol Has Decreased, But Still Above Nat'l Average for Grades 10 & 12







#### Binge Drinking - 5 or More Drinks in a Row in Past 2 Weeks





#### Perceived Risk of Harm if Have 5 or More Drinks 1-2x/Week





Past 30-Day Marijuana Use





### Perception of Moderate or Great Risk if Smoke Marijuana Once or Twice a Week
















