


9th Grade: A Critical Year For Prevention of Substance Use



Sources and Places of 10th Grade Underage Drinking

- 80.1% report getting alcohol at a party;
- 74.2 % report drinking alcohol at my home or someone else's home *without any parent permission*;
- 41.9% report getting alcohol from home without my parent's permission;
- 33.6% report drinking alcohol at their own home with their parents permission; and
- 35.9% report drinking alcohol at someone else's home with their parent's permission.


